



PRESERVATION TRUST OF VERMONT

What We Do: A Snapshot of 2024

FIELD WORK

We are **on the ground** helping communities:

- Support local preservation efforts through our Field Service Program (262 projects in 138 communities)
- Offer technical assistance and support to communities who experienced 2023 and 2024 July flood damage (four)
- Steward historically significant properties through our Historic Preservation Easement Program (95 easements on 135 buildings, three structures, and three archeological sites)

GET PROJECTS STARTED

We offer small **seed grants** to engage experts to get projects started on the right path:

- Provide project development and technical assistance grants through our Robert Sincerbeaux Fund (48)
- Provide technical assistance grants to owners of historic barns through our Barn Assessment Grant Program (17 barn owners)
- Award funding for special projects through the Paul A. Bruhn Fund (19 projects)

NIMBLE SUPPORT

Through special **initiatives and advocacy** work, we help efforts to build a more vital Vermont:

- Build local capacity and empower small rural communities through the Village Trust Initiative (seven projects)
- Encourage and help develop Community Supported Enterprises such as village stores, cooperatives, restaurants, and community-centered businesses (eight projects)
- Provide technical assistance and capacity building to Vermont's 24 designated downtowns to preserve historic character, economic vitality, and prevent sprawl
- Advocate for funding Vermont's Village and Downtown Tax Credit program

MAJOR SUPPORT

When resources are available, we provide **major support** for places important to Vermonters:

- Award grants to projects in Vermont's Northeast Kingdom in partnership with the Freeman Foundation (seven)
- Award grants to rural Vermont communities through Paul Bruhn Historic Revitalization grant program (eight)
- Award grants for preservation projects in partnership with the 1772 Foundation (14)
- Award grants for preservation projects in Bennington and Rutland counties through the Southern Vermont Fund (three)
- Manage major grants for projects awarded in previous years

EDUCATION & TRAINING

Through **gatherings and partnerships**, we share knowledge and expertise:

- Co-host the Downtown & Historic Preservation Conference (329 individuals from 65 communities)
- Host Preservation Retreats from May through October (86 individuals from 45 communities)
- Celebrate exceptional preservation work through our biennial Awards Program (nine projects)
- Distribute a monthly newsletter and special e-alerts for urgent issues
